

# Conservation Stewardship Program Application & Management Plan



Thank you for your interest in the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP). Before you complete this application, we highly recommend that you contact your county assessor to verify that enrolling into the CSP will not have an adverse effect on your property tax obligations. Your county assessor's office may also be able to provide you with the aerial map, and property record card required with the submittal of your application. The Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) recommends that a landowner consult with a wildlife or forestry professional to establish their management plan. There are a number of qualified consultants available throughout the state. If a management plan has already been established on the property, please indicate that when you get to the Plan Implementation section of this application. All applications must be completed and submitted before November 1st annually in order to have time for the property to be assessed in CSP for the following year.

## Maps:

Three maps are required to submit to CSP. All Aerial maps must be on an 8.5" x 11" or larger piece of paper. A direction arrow showing North must be on all Aerial maps. Please outline entire property boundary as well as the acreage that you would like to enroll into CSP. Write your name and Property Tax Index number(s) on any maps sent in to IDNR.

1. Assessors Map: This Aerial map will have property boundary identified by Property Tax Index number (PIN #s) of each of the parcels you would like to enroll into the CSP program. These maps can be obtained from your local county assessor's office or several county assessor's tax maps are available online. [See List](#) See [An Example Tax Assessors Map](#) here.

2. Aerial Stand Map: On your aerial photograph, identify areas in which you intend to manage for native species on your property. Distinguish forestry acreage from grassland acreage, pasture, etc. If you have large acreages of a single habitat type, use natural markers as stand boundaries (i.e. creek, ridge top, pond, etc.). On large properties, stands need to be distinguished and divided out. (Stand map may be drawn onto the aerial map thus having just a single map as long as the habitat types can be distinguished (i.e. don't fill in the stand with a colored pencil to show it, just outline it). These stands will be the management units you will be conducting management practices on. Aerial maps can be obtained from your county assessor's office and stands drawn onto the map. 3. Plat Book Map: Include a plat map with your application. A plat map is not a plat of survey. You will need this map in order to fill out Township, Range, and Section from the beginning of the plan. See [An Example Plat Map](#) here.

## Signatures and Approvals:



This Wildlife Management Plan was specifically crafted to meet the landowner's management goals and objectives for CSP. Success in achieving these goals requires implementation of the specific management objectives and practices outlined in the plan. The signed and approved plan makes the landowner eligible to voluntarily participate in the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) Conservation Stewardship Program.

By signing this application/management plan, the landowner agrees to conduct management on the property enrolled into the program and gives permission to IDNR personnel to access the property in order to evaluate ongoing management and future management needs. Actual compliance with the management plan is paramount in being eligible for the CSP.

The person who signs below is the owner or legal agent of the property for which this CSP management plan has been created. This plan has been prepared in accordance with the Conservation Stewardship Law (35 ILCS, 200/10-520) and meets the requirements. The landowner acknowledges that they have full legal access to the property in order to conduct management activities. If any change of ownership or condition of unimproved land occurs, the landowner will notify IDNR, the Office of Resource Conservation in writing within 30 days of occurrence.

An approved and certified conservation management plan guarantees an equalized assessed valuation at 5% its fair cash value for the acres enrolled in the CSP. This certification is only sent to the Department of Revenue after the management plan has been agreed on by the landowner and IDNR. You will receive a certification letter to sign before you have been officially enrolled.
